Dear Friend,

I was in a refugee camp in Jordan, speaking with women who had fled terror and warfare in Syria. The mother before me struggled to find the words to tell her story.

"We have left everything," she said, holding her little girl on her lap, "and now we are here with nothing. This is no life for my child."

I could see the pain and loss that she was grappling with. But I could also see what gave her strength. She laid her hand on her daughter's head as she spoke. She shared her story of trauma, but also her resolve to rebuild her life and a better world for her daughter.

She is a mother with a fighting spirit, one of so many across the world. Inside her burns a fierce determination to protect her children from the violence she has endured. She sees the future through the eyes of her daughter, and she wants more than anything for the young girl's life to be peaceful and safe.

This Mother's Day, we give thanks to all the fierce mothers of the world. They are women who live in war zones but still create spaces of peace and play for their children. They are women who see past the rubble of their ruined homes and past the flapping tents of refugee camps and instead envision new

possibilities for the generations to come.

See Your Impact for Women and Girls



SUDAN: Thanks to you, women farmers have a new way to earn an income, feed their families, send their children to school and invest in their communities. Over 100 women farmers are now benefiting from the oil miller that your support provided. This tool allows the women to extract oil from the sesame seeds and groundnuts they grow and sell it in local markets.

PHILIPPINES: Your dedication is sustaining women and their families in the Philippines so that they can rebuild their communities on a stronger foundation after Typhoon Haiyan. Thanks to your support,

"We came here to Jordan without knowing anybody. There are no jobs for us. It is hard to get food, and when my children are sick, it is difficult to find a doctor. But I am their mother, and this is why I fight every day for them. Thank you, MADRE, for helping me with my fight."



ADEELA is a mother in the West Bank, where Israeli soldiers restrict travel and make it difficult for laboring mothers to reach hospitals.

"When I was pregnant, I was very afraid to go to the hospital. What if soldiers stopped us and I could not reach the hospital? What would happen to my baby? I needed to ensure that she would be safe. That's why I was so happy to learn about MADRE and the midwife program. A midwife came to my house to check up on me. And when I went into labor, she came again to deliver my daughter safely. For that, I am grateful to you."
